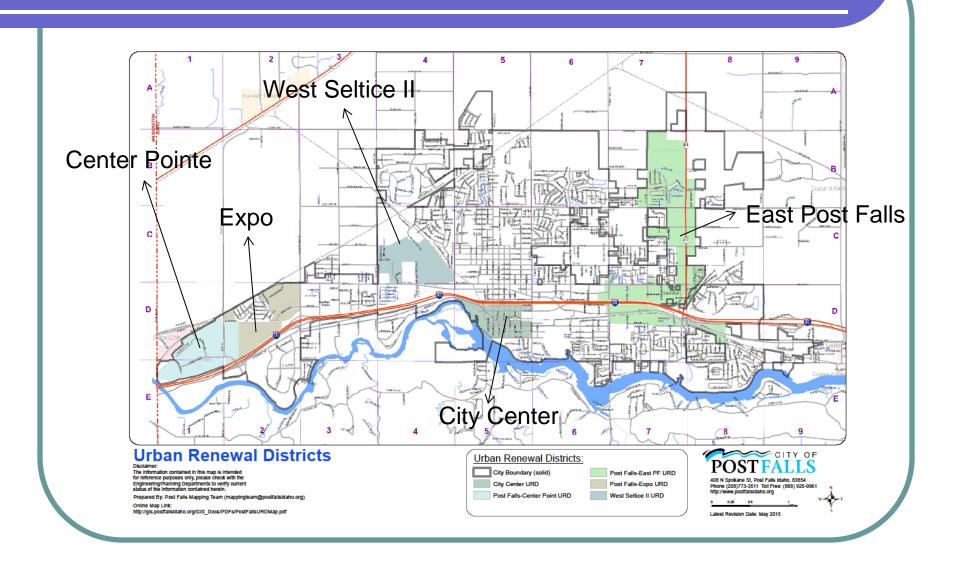
Annual Report for Calendar Year 2016

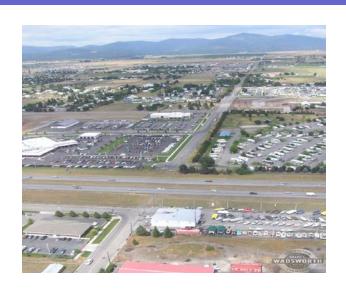
